

IBM MQ Administration I

This course teaches you how to customize, operate, and administer IBM MQ. The course covers architecture, configuration, and day-to-day administration.

The lab exercises give you practical experience with tasks such as creating an MQ network, managing client connections, configuring clusters, and more. You also learn how to handle undeliverable messages, create trigger actions based on events, and balance client workloads.
